Court Appointed Special Advocates: Empowers community members to serve as Volunteer Advocates and to be a voice for the best interest

of children who have been abused and neglected. A CASA, or Court Appointed Special Advocate, helps children in foster care navigate the whirlwind of change they face while in the child welfare system and ensure their needs are being met while working to help find safe, permanent homes.

Elderly Outreach: Provides persons age 60+ with emergency assistance for dentures, medicines,

hearing aids, eyeglasses, and transportation.

Parent Empowerment Program: Assists low-income parents enrolled in a college, university or trade school with tuition, books and limited family expenses. The goal of the program is to transition the family out of poverty by mentoring and providing a supportive roadmap toward success.

UNITED WAY FUNDED PROGRAMS: *High-Quality Childcare:* Provides educational programs for infants through Pre-K children and school-aged

children during the summer. Fees for the year-round program are based on household income with scholarships available. Breakfast, lunch, snacks, baby bottles, formula, and baby food are provided at no additional cost. Quarterly assessments help ensure all children meet their developmental milestones so they leave kindergarten ready. There are five locations: Carver, Guadalupe, New Directions, Phenix, and Talkington.

Family Legal Services: Provides low income clients in 12 counties across West Texas with first-rate legal assistance, advocacy, and quality counsel in matters of family and elder law. Family law matters include

protection from domestic violence, stability of the family in divorce, child support, uncontested adoptions, and suits affecting the parent child relationship. Elder law includes medical and statutory durable power of attorney, physician's directives, and simple wills. Brief advice and referrals are available for walk-ins and by phone.

Utilizing degreed and certified parent educators, the evidence based model for services provides twice monthly home visits as well as group activities to families from prenatal through kindergarten entry. In addition to the educational components of the program, families are also assisted in connecting with community resources that may improve their family's overall stability

and financial independence.

Community Education: Program Curricula and Volunteer Speakers Bureau designed specifically for target populations and presentations to civic groups and community organizations to provide education and awareness for the prevention and/or reduction of family violence.
