DISASTER SERVICES: Assists disaster victims, including food, clothing and temporary shelter to help families take the first step from crisis to stability; serves meals to emergency workers and handles requests for information from family members.

AFTER-SCHOOL AND SUMMER PROGRAMS: Provides a safe, positive

place for kids, ages 6 to 18 years old, at five locations. Programs focus on education and career development, character and leadership development, health and life skills, the arts, and sports, fitness and recreation. Includes after school pick up at approximately 15 elementary schools and several middle schools.

COURT APPOINTED SPECIAL ADVOCATES: Empowers community members to serve as Volunteer Advocates and to be a voice for the best interest

of children who have been abused and neglected. A CASA, or Court Appointed Special Advocate, helps children in foster care navigate the whirlwind of change they face while in the child welfare system and ensure their needs are being met while working to help find safe, permanent homes.

PARENT EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM: Assists lowincome parents enrolled in a college, university or trade school with tuition, books and limited family expenses. The goal of the program is to transition the family out of poverty by mentoring and providing a supportive roadmap toward success.

a multi-disciplinary team in the investigation of specific child abuse cases while also providing case reviews, free therapy, family advocacy, courtroom preparation/ accompaniment, and raising community education/ awareness of the problem of child sexual abuse.

HIGH-QUALITY CHILDCARE: Provides educational programs for infants through

Pre-K children and school-aged children during the summer. Fees for the year-round program are based on household income with scholarships available. Breakfast, lunch, snacks, baby bottles, formula, and baby food are provided at no additional cost. Quarterly assessments help ensure all children meet their developmental milestones so they leave kindergarten ready. There are five locations: Carver, Guadalupe, New Directions, Phenix, and Talkington.

In addition to the educational components of the program, families are also assisted in connecting with community resources that may improve their family's overall stability and financial independence.
